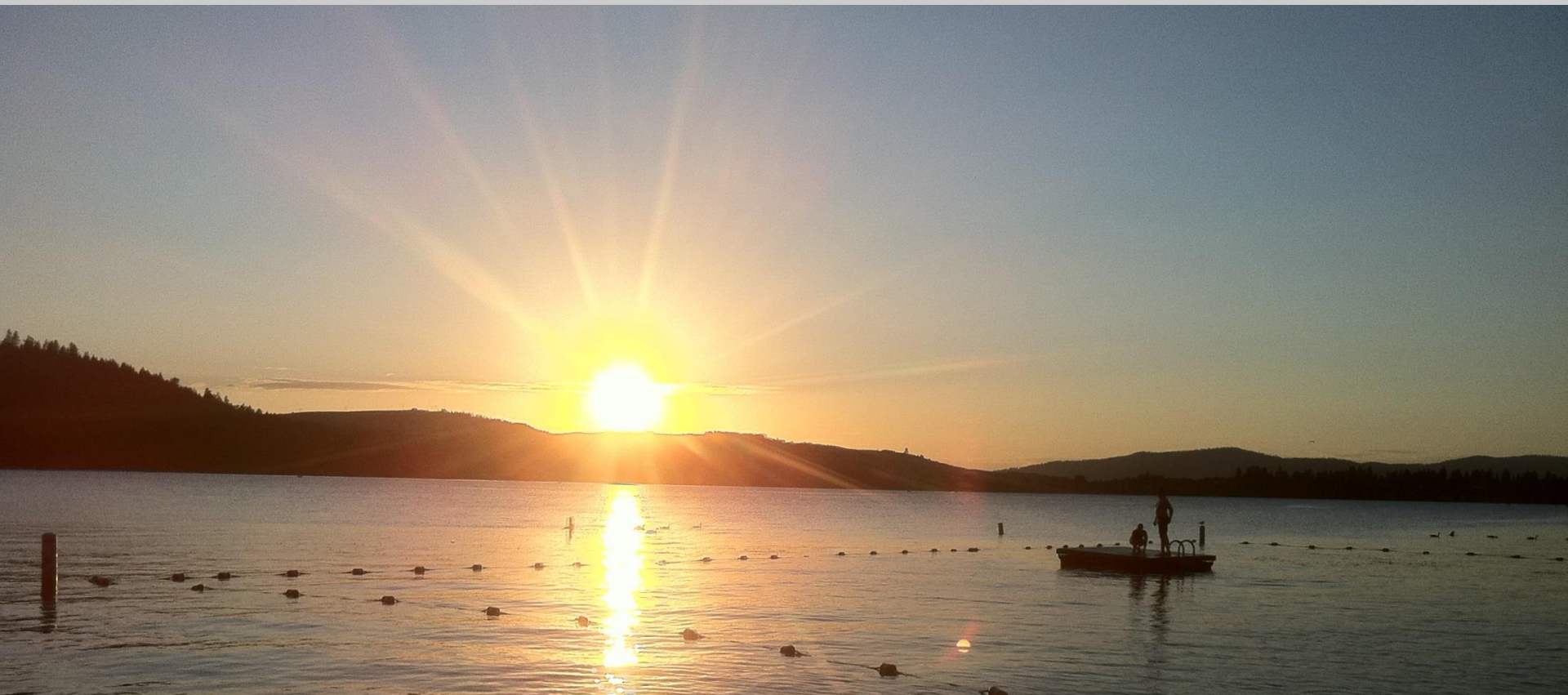

- \$950,000 WWRP Water Access & \$450,000 Local Appropriation



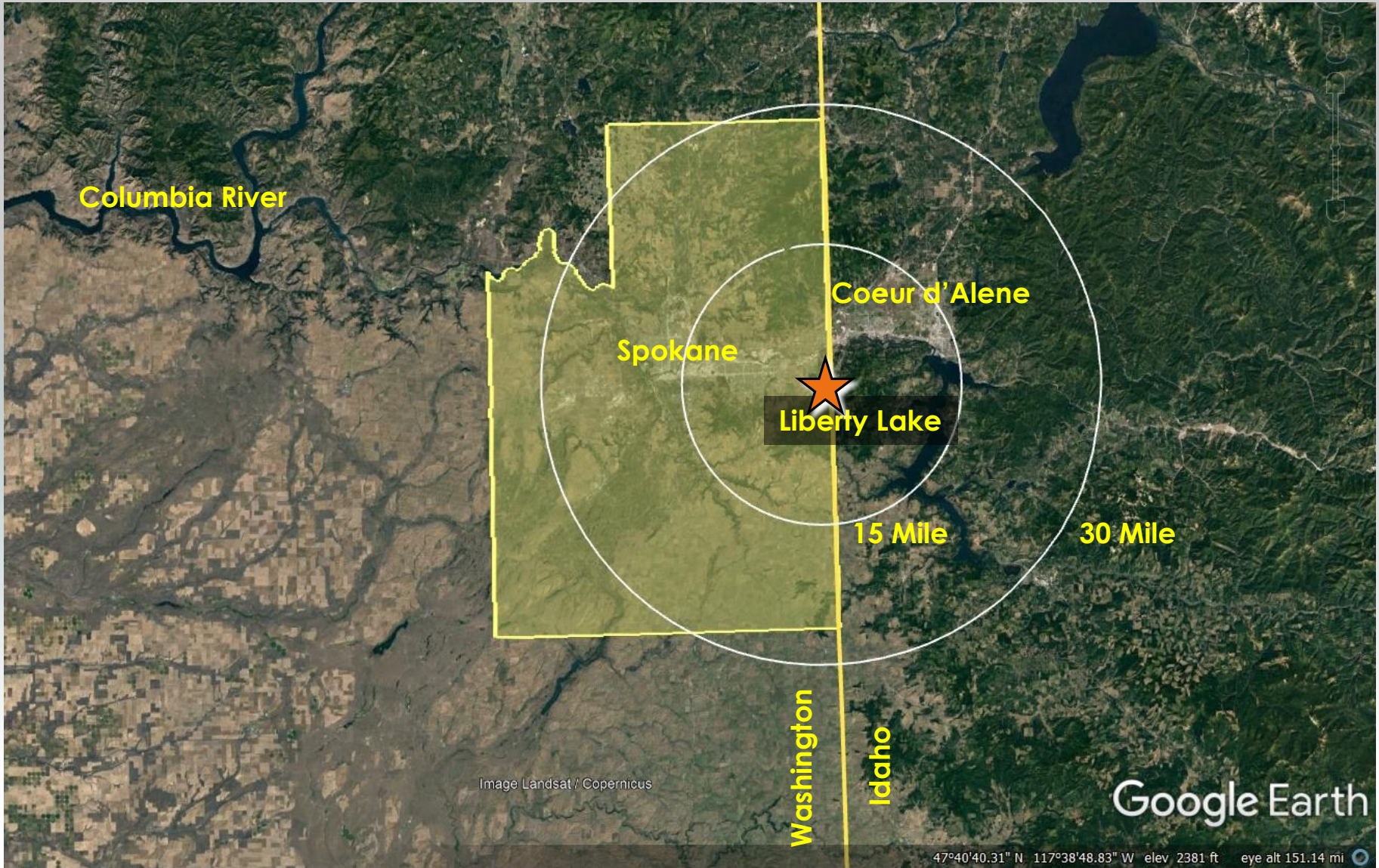

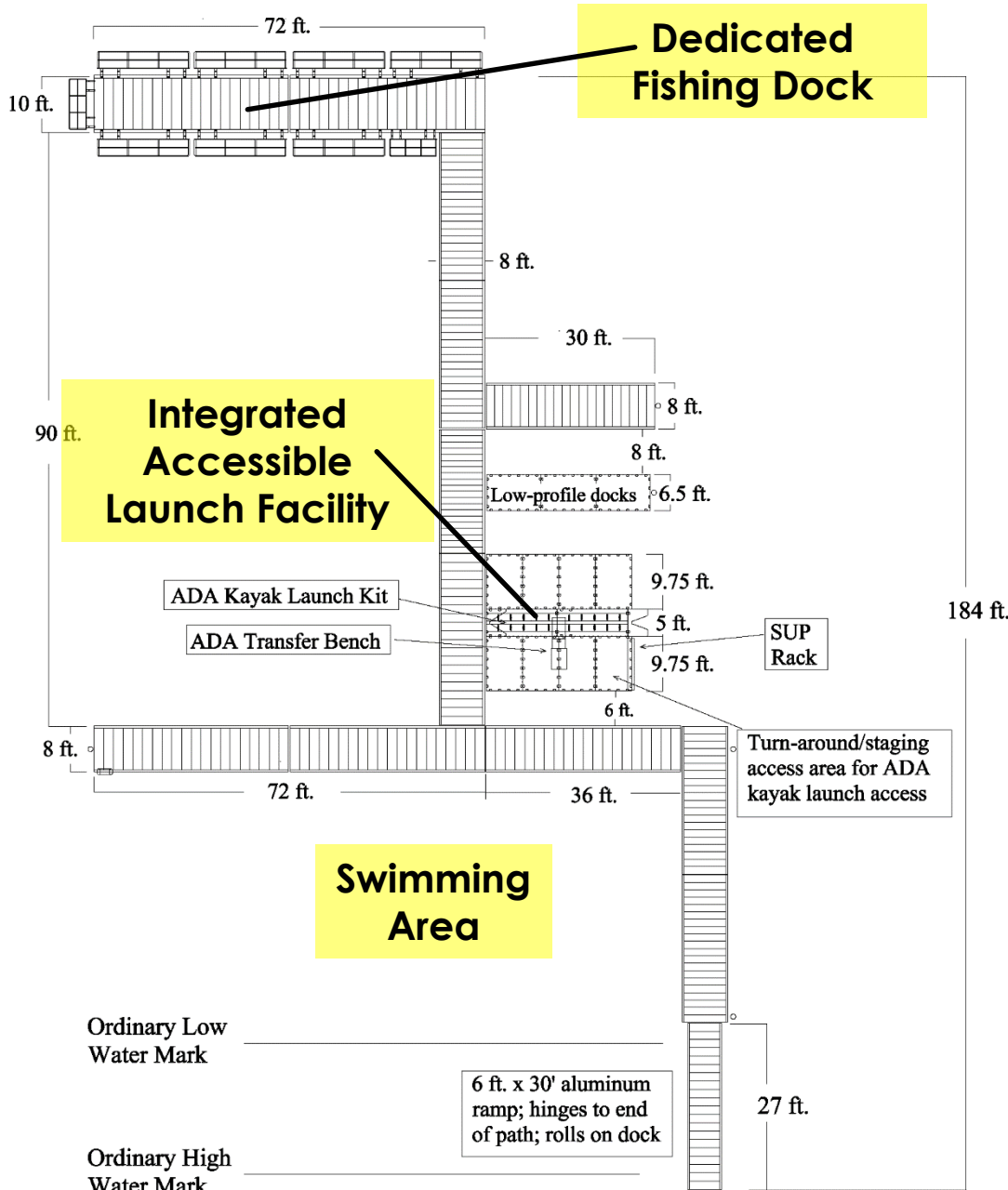

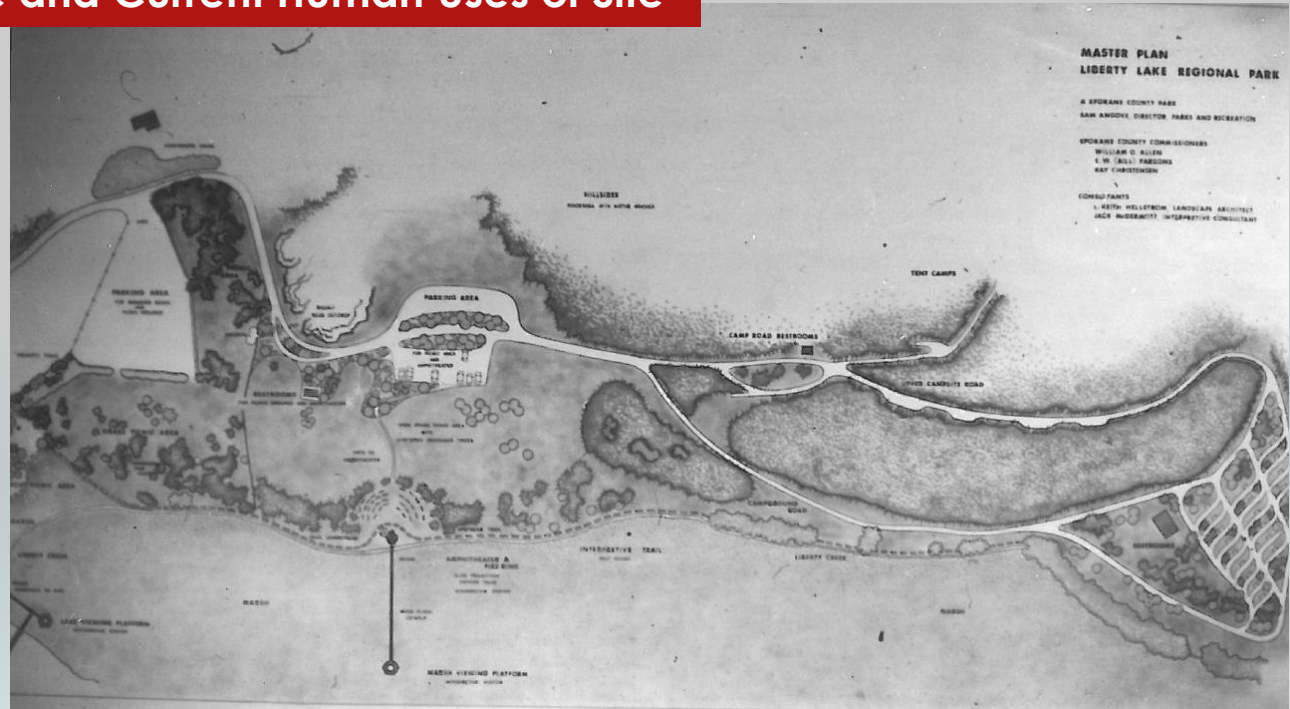
