## **Explanatory Statement**

Measure No. 1 Spokane County

Two-Tenths Of One Percent Sales And Use Tax For Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Correctional Infrastructure, And Behavioral Health Purposes

Measure No. 1 lets Spokane County voters determine by majority vote whether to authorize an additional County-wide sales and use tax of two-tenths of one percent (2/10 of 1%) for a 30-year time frame. For every \$10 spent by residents, visitors, and tourists in Spokane County, an additional 2¢ would be collected. The retail sale or use of motor vehicles and the first 36 months of a motor vehicle lease are exempt from the tax. It is projected that Measure No. 1 would annually raise \$31 million in 2025 growing to \$95 million annually in 2054.

Sixty percent (60%) of the tax revenue collected would be retained by Spokane County. Forty percent (40%) of the tax revenue collected would be distributed to cities and towns within Spokane County on a per capita basis. One-third (1/3) of any revenues collected must be spent for criminal justice purposes, including building and improving jails or correctional facilities. The remaining two-thirds (2/3) of any revenues collected must be spent for criminal justice, public safety and behavioral health purposes.

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 29A.32.280, the Board of County Commissioners desire to formally appoint committee of not more than three (3) to prepare arguments advocating voters' approval of Measure No. 1 and formally appoint a committee of not more than (3) to prepare arguments advocating voters' rejection of the Measure No. 1.
