Marking Your Ballot




Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.

Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for a contest will be an overvote and no votes for that ballot contest will be counted. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the name on the line provided and fill in the oval.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction or mismark your ballot, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice. In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (August 1, 2017).
