BEER DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

COMPLETING ENTRY FORMS: All exhibitors must use entry form found at the conclusion of the book and they must be postmarked on or before August 6, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663. Particular care should be given in the preparation of all entry forms. Full and correct information must be given. Staff will be available in the Ag Building from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. on August 6 to assist you with your entry form if needed.

ARRIVING FOR EXHIBIT DROP-OFF: Please take exhibits to the south door of the Ag. Building accessible from the South Gate off Havana Street, then through the Yellow Gate just east of Avista Stadium.

PASSES / TICKETS: Care of the exhibit items is not required during the operating days of the Fair, thus passes and tickets will not be distributed. Exhibitors are encouraged to purchase discounted tickets at the Fair Office beginning in June and running through September 5.

EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR: The Department Superintendent and/or Fair Coordinator may exclude an exhibit from being exhibited at the Fair if it is not properly prepared. Each exhibit shall be placed according to the decision of the judge and such placing shall be final. Anyone interfering with a judge will forfeit the right of prize money. Any protest regarding the judging shall be made in writing and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Fair Office within 24 hours after the cause of the protest. If the Fair sustains the appeal, the fee will be refunded. The Fair reserves the right to cancel or combine classes/lots as needed, as well as substitute judges. Classes/lots may be combined or cancelled due to number of entries. If there is no competition in a class/lot for two years, the class/lot may be dropped.

EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR (Additional Youth Information): This department is open to adult exhibitors only with the exception of Class 3 (Soda Pop). Youth exhibitors in Class 3 must not be under 5 years of age or over 18 years of age as of 01/01/24.

FURTHER DEPARTMENT INFORMATION: The following information is provided to further clarify.

- o Competition is open to AMATEUR home brewers and AMATEUR wine makers.
- o Items entered for judging must have been created by the exhibitor during the past year, since September 2023.
- Each item may compete for one prize money award and may be entered in one class / lot.
- Exhibitor may make only one (1) entry in any one lot except as described below. Exhibitors are NOT limited only to entries as described in each class, but instead are encouraged to enter additional exhibits in their proper class under lot listed "Other". More than one entry will be permitted in "Other" lot as long as each entry is a different type of beer and entered as a sub lot. For Example: Class 1, Lot 19 Other, Peach Ale; Class 1, Lot 19A Other, Raspberry Cream Ale; Class 1, Lot 19B Other, Spruce Beer.
- All entries must be made at home.
- o Exhibitors are responsible for entering their entries into the correct class and lot. Entries entered incorrectly will not be judged.
- Each exhibit shall be placed according to the decision of the judge and such placing shall be final. Anyone interfering with a judge will forfeit the
 right of prize money. Judges have the right to open any container.

BEER / SODA POP / KOMBUCHA EXHIBIT SPECIFICS:

- Class 1 An entry will consist of three bottles (12 oz). No green or clear bottles. Crown caps only, no grosch or wire top bottles. Two bottles will be used for judging and one for display. Bottles should not be labeled.
- Classes 2 and 3 An entry will consist of two bottles (12 oz). No green or clear bottles. Crown caps only, no grosch or wire top bottles. One bottle will be used for judging and one for display. Exhibitors are encouraged to enter their own homemade label on the bottles which will be judged as well.
- Recipe form must be completed and rubberbanded to all 3 bottles. Recipe must not include any metric measurements. Entries will not be judged without recipes.
- Beer will be judged on visual (color, clarity, head, sound), in mouth (taste, feel), aroma / bouquet (hops, grains), and post evaluation (aftertasting / finish).

WINE EXHIBIT SPECIFICS:

- An entry will consist of two fifth (750 ml) bottles. Only traditional type bottles with corks or screw tops will be accepted. Dessert wines may, however, be bottled in ½ bottles (375 ml). One bottle will be used for judging and one for display. Include an extra cork.
- Recipe form must be completed and rubberbanded to one bottle. Entries will not be judged without recipes.
- Recipe should include type of wine, amount of batch made, ingredients (including pounds of fruit, type and amount of sugar), starting specific
 gravity reading, type of yeast, additional additives, date started, date bottled, and specific gravity reading at bottling time.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS: Please pickup exhibits via the south door of Building A of the Expo Complex (Ag. Building) accessible from the South Gate off Havana Street, then through the Yellow Gate just east of Avista Stadium. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless superintendent or assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Monday, September 15. If you have not left the office a self-addressed, stamped envelope for your prize money check and would like us to mail your check to you, you may leave the envelope with the department clerk upon picking up your exhibits.

PRIZE MONEY: Only exhibits listed in the Exhibitor's Guide will be accepted for prize money awards. For prize money, judge may or may not award all placings according to their discretion. Awards will be based on judges' records. Ribbons and tags shall not be considered proof for payment of prize money awards. Awards in all classes/lots will be made on a point system, listed for each exhibit. The money <u>per point</u> will be the same for all exhibits and will be calculated by dividing all prize money by the total points awarded. Prize money will be forfeited by exhibitors failing to adhere to the release times printed in the Exhibitor's Guide. Prize money checks may be picked up at the Fair Office between October 15 and 31 (Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Checks remaining after October 31 and/or checks not cashed by November 30 will become forfeited and considered a donation to the SCF&EC. To clarify, the checks will not be considered "abandoned" property under Chapter 63.29 RCW, but will be a donation by the payee to the SCF&EC. Prize money checks will NOT be issued or re-issued after November 30. If you are unable to pick up your prize money check, you may mail the office a self-addressed, stamped envelope with a request for us to mail your check. Prize money will be paid according to the following point system:

SPECIAL AWARDS

Beer – Judged on the Danish System. All blue, red, and white entries will receive rosettes and prize money.

Beer - Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Amateur Beer will be awarded trophies and rosettes.

Beer - Best of Show in Class 2 (Soda Pop) will be awarded a rosette.

Beer - Best of Show in Class 3 (Kombucha) will be awarded a rosette.

Wine - Judged on the Danish System. All blue, red, and white entries will receive rosettes and prize money.

Wine - Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Wine will be awarded trophies and rosettes.

Beer and Wine - Best of Lot and Participation will NOT receive prize money or awards.

SUPERINTENDENT: Superintendent shall be in full charge of the department to which assigned and shall administer all policies pertaining to the respective department. Superintendent shall have charge of the entries, judge's sheets, and award sheets and shall be responsible for their being filled out correctly and returned to the Fair Office. Superintendent has authority to discharge exhibits not meeting quality standards. Any protest regarding the duties of Superintendents, <u>MUST</u> be made to the Fair Coordinator.

ADDITIONAL FAIR INFORMATION: No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter upon the grounds except from their place of business or exhibit space. No person shall distribute advertising matter upon the grounds, including, "For Sale" signs without Superintendent Approval. A "For Sale" bulletin board will be centrally located within each building / department for exhibitor use. The distribution of handbills, fliers, and heralds will not, under any circumstances, be permitted. Anyone violating this rule is subject to fine or expulsion from the grounds. Begging, soliciting, singing, and/or public speaking are prohibited. All concession space will be sold by the management and application must be made in writing. Under no circumstances will anyone be permitted to operate a concession without a signed agreement. 24-hour guard service is provided during the Fair. The Fair will use every precaution for safe preservation of entries on exhibit, but will not be responsible for loss or damage. Spokane County Sheriff supervises police protection. Spokane Valley Fire Department supervises fire protection. Only seeing-eye dogs or dogs participating in an approved demonstration or commercial booth will be allowed on the grounds. Service animals trained for a specific service to aid the person they are accompanying will be allowed on the grounds. Companion animals will not be permitted. Smoking in the buildings and barns is prohibited. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the grounds except in the Beer Garden.

The Leaning Tower of Pisa (also known as the Torre Pendente di Pisa) is a medieval structure in Pisa, Italy. It's settling foundations caused the building to lean 4 to 5 degrees from the perpendicular in the late 20th century due to unstable soil. At one point, the tower's lean even switched directions. Mussolini tried to fix the tower but his efforts only made it worse. Restoration work between 1993 and 2001 stabilized the building reducing the tilt to 3.97 degrees. The tower was built as a freestanding bell tower for the nearby cathedral (Pisa Cathedral) and took 200 years to build. The building has been listed as one of the seven Wonders of the World.

Construction on the building began in 1174 and the leaning began around construction of the third floor. A halt in the building's progress took place from 1185 to 1260. It was completed in 1360. At one time, prior to renovation, the building was leaning at a 10 degree angle. Today, visitors (45 at a time) can go inside and climb to the top of the tower (approximately 300 steps). Guests are limited to 30-minutes stays and visitors are encouraged to obtain tickets well in advance as it is the city's most popular tourist attraction.
