
Sample Ballot Spokane County Washington February 14, 2023 Special Election

Proposition No. 1 Spokane Valley Fire Department Maintenance and Operations Excess Levy

The Board of Spokane Valley Fire Department adopted Resolution No. 2022-526, concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation costs.

This proposition would authorize, pursuant to RCW 84.52.130, the levy of excess taxes in replacement of an expiring levy in the amount of \$25,000,000.00 per year for four consecutive years beginning in 2023 to be collected in each year following at an approximate levy rate of \$1.08 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation. The levy will provide funding necessary to maintain the level of fire protection and emergency medical services within the Department.
